Yn ddiweddar, cafodd yr adeilad presennol ei wagio o'i holl ddodrefn ac offer - yn barod ar gyfer y gwaith sydd ar y gweill i ddymchwel rhan o'r adeilad. - Ropeworks, Llanberis sydd wedi cael y Wal Ddringo

Teithiau'n ailgychwyn o'r Ganolfan Dros Dro i Ymwelwyr

O ddechrau Ebrill 2019, bydd y teithiau'n ailgychwyn, ac yn gadael o Ganolfan Dros Dro i Ymwelwyr. Bydd y Ganolfan hon yn sicrhau bod teithiau Gorsaf Bŵer Dinorwig, sy'n denu 35,000 o ymwelwyr i'r ardal bob blwyddyn, yn parhau i weithredu yn ystod y cyfnod ailddatblygu. Gan y bydd y cyfleusterau'n gyfyngedig yn yr adeilad dros dro, ni fydd siop na chyfleusterau caffi ar gael.

Update on Redevelopment of Electric Mountain Visitor Centre, Llanberis

First Hydro Company* is currently redeveloping the Electric Mountain Visitor Centre to create a modern, appealing tourist & community asset with facilities to better suit the needs of users. Find out more about how the works are progressing.

Progress of Works & Community Benefit

The existing building has recently been emptied of all furniture and equipment - ready for planned partial demolition to take place. These furnishings were donated to local community groups with the assistance of Antur Waunfawr; an Anglesey & Gwynedd based not-for-profit enterprise which provides employment and training opportunities for people with learning disabilities.

Some of the other beneficiaries of the equipment included:

- Neuadd Ogwen, a social enterprise which promotes regeneration projects for the Dyffryn Ogwen community
- The Wales Air Ambulance Charity Shop in Caernarfon
- Plas Pengwaith home for the elderly in Llanberis
- Ropeworks, Llanberis will be making good use of the Traverse Wall



The start date of the redevelopment work is not yet confirmed, however once the way forward is agreed we will communicate the details.

Tours recommencing from Temporary Visitor Centre

From early April 2019, tours will recommence, departing from a Temporary Visitor Centre. This Centre will ensure that Dinorwig Power Station tours, which attract 35,000 visitors to the area annually, will continue to operate during the redevelopment period. As facilities will be limited at the temporary building, neither a gift shop nor café facilities will be available.
